# Some Internet Tools: Eudora and Email

This article explains the mail program Eudora. It follows last month's introductory article about the Internet.

**Eudora** is a mail program produced by Qualcomm and runs on a Mac or a PC. It is freely available and can be upgraded to a commercial version.

### Setup steps

- 1. Set Eudora up where it is going to receive mail: (mail) SMTP server: mail.ozemail.com.au
- Tell Eudora what your mail account is: POP account: dwalker@ozemail.com.au
- Tell Eudora where your mail's attachments will be saved:
   C:\EUDORA\ATTACH

## Steps for sending and receiving mail

- Create a new message using the Message menu item. This pops up a blank message. Email addresses look like this: fred@place
- 2. Type a message as you would for a word processor
- 3. Send it

Mail keeps coming in all the time. You may wish to look in your IN tray and browse

over the incoming information. After a while you will have enough mail to sort them into separate folders. Mailbox and Transfer commands allow you to create separate folders for this purpose.

Eudora has a feature which allows you to do the equivalent of including enclosures with your letters. It lets you attach a file to the message.

Eudora also has facilities to send any type of data, including text, spreadsheets, database files and programs. Behind the scenes, Eudora handles these formats using special codes. (Gurus would know these codes as MIME and BinHex.)

Once you have received a message, you may wish to reply. You create a reply using the Message command, often including chunks of the original message to give that friendly touch!

Ignore any strange names and messages at the head of the mail you receive. They are for computer use only.

It is hard to trace bounced mail. However, if you wish to do so, check to whom you sent your mail, even ringing them up, to check their true email address.

### Mailing lists

Apart from one-to-one communications, email is invaluable because it is so common. There are many mailing lists on the Internet. One mailing list, which AusSI members read, is called INDEX-L, which is organised by New York University and Georgia Southern University.

I will now show you how to join this mailing list. Naturally, you will need to send your own name and email address instead of mine when you send the following message:

LISTSERV@BINGVMB.CC.BING HAMTON.EDU (There is no gap between 'BING' and 'HAMTON'.)
From: dwalker@zeta.org.au (Dwight Walker)
subscribe INDEX-L Dwight Walker

If you wish to send a message to the INDEX-L list, send the following type of message:

Subject: blah blah

To stop receiving mail from INDEX-L, send something similar to this:

#### Address books

If you have a collection of commonly used email addresses, Eudora provides nicknames. You can use them instead of the

long email addresses, which are awkward to type. For example:

nickname index-l

instead of

email address INDEX-L@BINGVMB.CC.BING HAMTON.EDU

Now you can use index-l instead of the long email address above!

## NSW Report

## Indexing Education

The NSW branch continued to sponsor courses conducted through the School of Information, Library and Archive Studies at the University of New South Wales.

The courses held during this year were Introduction to Book Indexing, Computeraided Indexing and Thesaurus Construction. The Thesaurus Construction workshop was held in Sydney for the first time, following the framework of a similar workshop in Brisbane for the Cataloguers Section of ALIA (Queensland), which Alan Walker conducted earlier in the year.

The courses on Indexing Technical Material and Indexing/Abstracting for Databases were not run this year because of insufficient demand but will be offered again in 1995.

#### AusSI Medal

Following through on a resolution passed at the Marysville conference in April, the NSW branch committee has agreed to take over the planning and award of the AusSI medal for 1995. Alan Walker has volunteered to coordinate the awarding of the medal. The committee met on 17 May 1995 to begin planning.

Kingsley Siebel and Alan Walker of the NSW branch were runners-up for the medal in 1994.

## **ACT Report**

On Wednesday 7 June 1995, the ACT branch held a discussion meeting on 'Are computers tools for indexers or replacements for indexers?'

Robert Hyslop described how his productivity increased by using Macrex as a tool for back-of-book indexing.

He estimated that he saved 40% of his time, particularly through the correction and reference facilities of the program.

Susan MacDougall declared that this should be the year of the indexer because Internet users were getting frustrated with the overload of unfiltered information. Where currency of information was important, people were prepared to use simple keywords for searching and to compile their own personal indexes.

In the environment of cost recovery and lack of government subsidies, Lynn Farkas

noted that database services were under threat. Lynn saw a bleak future for the database indexer in a world full of text CD-ROMs with simple key word indexing. Information was moving out of the control of the traditional information providers into the realms of economists and computer scientists.

Costly editorial and indexing services are being sacrificed as automatic indexing, abstracting and editing programs become more sophisticated. Lynn therefore saw the future opportunites for indexing as lying in professional education for indexers and in indexing societies pushing for quality indexing on the Internet.

In the lively discussion that followed, it was suggested that indexers should work with computer professionals to promote quality indexing. This may be as a special interest group to computer societies or by inviting computer specialists to indexing conferences.

Indexing societies could set guidelines for the Internet, which would promote indexing as a means of overcoming the time-wasting frustrations of searching an amorphous mass of information.

It was proposed that a workshop or conference be held on the topic of 'Indexing in the electronic age'.

## Saving keystrokes #3

Assigning text to function keys CINDEX will store up to 20 phrases of your choice, and recall them at the press of the appropriate function key.

To assign text to a function key type SET KEYS and press Enter. Use the  $\downarrow$  key to move to the key you want to assign; the first ten are F1 to F10, the second ten are Shift plus F1 to F10. F1 to F9 are pre-set but can be changed to whatever you wish.

Suppose you want to assign the corporate name Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organization to Shift-F10. Move the ↓ key to ↑F10, type the name in, and then press Enter (Esc in version 5.x). Now whenever you press Shift-F10 when adding entries the full name will appear at the cursor.

## Assigning commands to function keys

Any command can also be assigned to a function key and if you follow the command with a semicolon, the command will execute immediately upon pressing the function key (without having to press Enter).

For example, type SET KEYS and use the  $\downarrow$ key to move to F10; type in exit; (with the semicolon) and press Enter (Esc in version 5.x). Now whenever you press F10 at the command line you will save and exit from CINDEX with one keystroke.
